



## Terms and Conditions

Project Playmaker is part of Onside Soccer, charity number 1149686, and participation in Project Playmaker activities requires all participants to adhere and agree to Onside Soccer's terms and conditions as detailed below.

Onside Soccer commits itself to providing football coaching for children and young people in a **fun, safe, friendly and inclusive** environment. As well as **developing better players**, we place a strong emphasis on **developing better people**. To do this we have a Code of Conduct for Coaches and a Code of Conduct for Players which we expect to be supported and followed by their parent(s).

Onside Soccer, its coaches, servants, employees or agents accept no responsibility under any circumstances for any loss (consequential or otherwise), damage, expense or delay suffered or incurred by the Parent, the Pupil or any other party arising directly or indirectly or in any way connected with the attendance of the pupil at the course (or any part of it) or any other act or omission on the part of Onside Soccer or agents even if such act or omission is negligent. I give permission for my son/daughter to take part in Onside Soccer training sessions, including weekly training sessions and special events.

The parent/guardian of the participating child agrees that in case of injury to said child, that they hereby waive all claims against Onside Soccer including all coaches and affiliates, all participants, sponsoring agencies, advertisers, and, if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event. There is a risk of being injured that is inherent in all sports activities, including soccer. Some of these injuries include, but are not limited to, the risk of fractures, paralysis, or death. The parent/guardian understands that the leaders will take all reasonable care in looking after said child but they cannot necessarily be held responsible for any injury incurred or for any loss or damage to property.

The parent/guardian of the participating child understands that one child's behaviour must not be allowed to endanger or be a constant distraction to the other children in the group. Abuse, both verbal and/or physical, against a member of Onside Soccer staff or another child will not be tolerated. If at any time a child's behaviour is extremely anti-social then temporary or permanent exclusion may be implemented immediately. In the unlikely event of this happening Onside Soccer will not accept responsibility for any issues caused by the child's exclusion. The standard of behaviour regarded as unacceptable will be determined by Onside Soccer.
